### **Significant March Fires Throughout U.S. History:**

"New London School Explosion", New London, TX - March 18<sup>th</sup>, 1937

At least 295 fatalities

3<sup>rd</sup> worst disaster in Texas history

"Great New Orleans Fire", New Orleans, LA - March 21<sup>st</sup>, 1788

- The fire destroyed 856 of the 1,100 structures in the city of New Orleans.
- 3 ships were sent to Philadelphia for provisions immediately after the fire.

"Triangle Shirtwaist Factory Fire", New York, NY - March 25<sup>th</sup>, 1911

- 146 fatalities
- Incident resulted in a call for reforms in fire safety and workplace safety.

# **LEGISLATIVE UPDATE**

Effective February 12, 2022, the Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code (UCC) will utilize the state-amended 2018 edition of the International Codes, with the exception of the IBC Chapter 11 Accessibility Code. There is a six-month grace period which allows a permit applicant to have projects reviewed under the PA-IBC 2015 or PA-IBC 2018 edition. August 12, 2022 is the finial application day to choose a code version.

based Many states require code-compliance on the permit application date. Pennsylvania law requires compliance based on the design or construction project's contract date. This is critical since initial design documents may be started well in advance of a code cycle and new regulation adoptions can affect construction budgets. Typical the architect will list the applicable code versions on the primary cover sheet and these should be followed for the entire construction tier. An AHJ may request proof of the contract date to validate the requested code version. For further information, see the implementation language from the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act of 1999, Chapter 3, § 304.

The I-Codes are divided up into 15 individual codes. For accessibility provisions, Pennsylvania has adopted the most up-to-date standards for new and existing construction from Chapter 11 (Accessibility) and Appendix E of the 2021 International Building Code (IBC) as well as the 2021 International Existing Building Code (IEBC). The PA UCC building accessibility requirements took effect on January 1, 2022, with a six-month grace period.

*Reminder:* L&I has already granted Philadelphia permission to use the 2018 edition of the I-codes. Philly will maintain their own modified version of the 2018 IBC, since they are a Class A city.
